The concert hall was filled with gently humming low-pitched voices. One could feel a certain excitement and anticipation. The grand piano was ready, on stage, waiting for the maestro. On the front seats were two ladies chatting, with their respective children either side. During all this, one of the children, five years old, unseen by mum, toddled up to the stage and started playing the piano as any five-year old might. Plink-a-plonk, with no melody, nothing. Just random notes. A hush came over the audience, mum was mortified, mortified into paralysis, unable to collect her son. Was anyone else prepared to gently usher the boy back to his embarrassed mum?

Seconds later, the maestro came out to a round of applause, and without introduction he crouched behind the child, and with arms around the child, started to play the piano, such that you almost felt that the child's random plink-a-plonks were part of the overall melody and music. Such was the skill of the maestro. This went on for a few minutes. When he was satisfied that the child had 'played' enough, he tenderly handed the child back to his mum. He then began his repertoire.

At the end, he received thunderous applause, as great as his musical prowess was, what do you think the people spoke about most on leaving the concert hall? And subsequently? No prizes for guessing! A true story from about 100 plus years ago. So beautiful.

It illustrates something of the Holy Spirit. Wherever there are gaps are in our lives, the Holy Spirit will fill. If our prayer allows him to, if we're in touch. Are we? Many are not.

Yes we can feel frightened, lack confidence, not feel up to it. We so doubt ourselves. Being in touch with Our Lord's Spirit lets us be 'on fire' like the disciples and do amazing things even when we're unsure or frightened – as were the disciples. And we surprise ourselves especially when our life's notes are random and seem to have little or no melody - no melody of order, depth, purpose .or meaning.

Claim the Holy Spirit. He is there for the taking. Will we avail ourselves of Him? Despite our own inadequacies, let's be sure to be in touch with this Holy Spirit, and quite possibly, amaze even ourselves.

Celebrate 40 years of team at Walsingham House with us, beginning with Mass celebrated by Bishop Alan at 12pm followed by celebrations at our beautiful retreat house just outside Brentwood.

Children's Liturgy Appeal – please read

We are appealing for people to consider coming forward as leaders, so that we are able to continue providing two age group sessions on a weekly basis.

Our aim each week is to help the children to engage with the Gospel in a way that is meaningful in their lives.

We read the Gospel in age appropriate language, and spend time exploring its message through talking, sometimes music, and a variety of activities.

We have 2 groups:

- 1) Younger group age 3 years up to school year 2. We ask that children come independently, after a settling in session or two, as this enables the group to focus.
- 2) Older group school years 3 to 6.

Each group has 2 adults in the room - a leader and an assistant -so that requires 4 adults per week for the rota. This is why we need to expand our team, to share the load.

To be a leader, you don't need to be a teacher, or be a parent or an expert on the Bible......you just need an enthusiasm to share Jesus' message.

We especially need leaders, but assistants are also welcome. Committing to one Sunday per month in term time would make a huge difference to our team.

We would love to diversify our team – it's good for our children to see both male and female leaders. For example, young adults would be such a good role model for our children.

We have a wealth of our own resources to give ideas, and we can direct you to trusted online resources too. You would not be alone, you would be well supported and eased in. You would be able to choose the age group you feel comfortable working with. Perhaps you might even consider doing this in a pair, with a friend.

We know that the children and young people are the future of the church.....but you can't be the future unless you are fully part of the present.

We should be so grateful if you would think about this....pray about this.....and if you have any thoughts or questions, please come and talk to any of the team, without any pressure. (or call/text 07801 888787)

Personal reflection from a longstanding previous leader, Sandra:

It has been both my and Linda's absolute pleasure to have had the opportunity to share our faith with the children of our parish, many of whom bring their own children now. We are not teachers. We are members of the parish who believe that leading the children in prayer and explaining the Sunday Gospel in a way that captures their attention and speaks directly to them, and most importantly allows them to express their thoughts, questions and prayer requests, is essential. We have found joy in sharing our faith with the children of our parish. Please consider leading the children. You gain as much from them as they do from you and there are many occasions to smile with some of their innocent comments and accounts.

Quote:

I asked the children who they would like to pray for and one child said, "I want to pray for my nanny." I asked if she was ill. "No she's dead." I said, "Oh let's pray for her soul." "No she is out of her wheelchair and better now!" You see, miracles do happen in our parish!

Thank you to all the big and little ones for making our Sunday groups so special!

When we hear the word of God and respond, as the early disciples did, our souls will find joy. Joy is also to be found in helping the children of the parish better understand the word of God, at a level that encourages conversation, questions and prayer.
