Psalter Week 2

Depressed. For many years, he was anxious, neurotic and selfish. Everyone kept nagging him to change. Whilst in his head he agreed he should, he resented it. No matter how much he tried, he simply couldn't change. Even his closest friend urged him to change – this hurt him most. He felt powerless and trapped. Then one day, in a moment of inspiration, his friend said, <u>actually, don't change</u>. <u>Do not change</u>. <u>I love you as you are</u>. Those words <u>don't change</u>; <u>do not change</u>. <u>I love you as you are</u> were music to his ears. He relaxed. He came alive. And guess what? Yes. He changed.

He couldn't really change for the better till he found someone to love him whether he changed or not. This is how God loves us. God loves us exactly as we are, sins and all. Change or no change. Yet, as much as he loves us as we are, his love somehow encourages us to change, to change for the better.

It is so easy to expect someone to change into how *we perceive* they should be. The problem above. And we think we are loving. Yet, all we are doing is trying to *re-create them* into our own ideas of how we think they should be! Isn't that God's job? Rather, we are called to love as every person is. Once we do, then miracles start happening, extraordinary changes and transformations can happen.

God loves us, *not if* we are good, God loves us *so we can be good*. Feel the difference? God doesn't love us *if we* change, God loves us *so we can change, confidently,* for the better. Our lives can be in a mess because we are not aware of this unconditional love. We don't earn or merit such love, it is unconditionally there. The only difference is in those who are aware of it and enjoy it, and those who are not. Do your children need to *earn* your love as parents? Of course not.

So God loves us exactly as we are. And that is the irony. That he loves us so much, his love encourages us to change for the better and not to remain as we are.

Have we experienced this great love from God that Jesus speaks about? It is there! If not, what might we need to do, or be, or let go of, to experience this inherent, unconditional love, and, quite probably, be changed for the better?

Children's Liturgy Appeal – please read

We are appealing for people to consider coming forward as leaders, so that we are able to continue providing two age group sessions on a weekly basis.

Our aim each week is to help the children to engage with the Gospel in a way that is meaningful in their lives.

We read the Gospel in age appropriate language, and spend time exploring its message through talking, sometimes music, and a variety of activities.

We have 2 groups:

- 1) Younger group age 3 years up to school year 2. We ask that children come independently, after a settling in session or two, as this enables the group to focus.
- 2) Older group school years 3 to 6.

Each group has 2 adults in the room - a leader and an assistant -so that requires 4 adults per week for the rota. This is why we need to expand our team, to share the load.

To be a leader, you don't need to be a teacher, or be a parent or an expert on the Bible......you just need an enthusiasm to share Jesus' message.

We especially need leaders, but assistants are also welcome. Committing to one Sunday per month in term time would make a huge difference to our team.

We would love to diversify our team – it's good for our children to see both male and female leaders. For example, young adults would be such a good role model for our children.

We have a wealth of our own resources to give ideas, and we can direct you to trusted online resources too. You would not be alone, you would be well supported and eased in. You would be able to choose the age group you feel comfortable working with. Perhaps you might even consider doing this in a pair, with a friend.

We know that the children and young people are the future of the church.....but you can't be the future unless you are fully part of the present.

We should be so grateful if you would think about this....pray about this.....and if you have any thoughts or questions, please come and talk to any of the team, without any pressure. (or call/text 07801 888787)

Personal reflection from a longstanding previous leader, Sandra:

It has been both my and Linda's absolute pleasure to have had the opportunity to share our faith with the children of our parish, many of whom bring their own children now. We are not teachers. We are members of the parish who believe that leading the children in prayer and explaining the Sunday Gospel in a way that captures their attention and speaks directly to them, and most importantly allows them to express their thoughts, questions and prayer requests, is essential. We have found joy in sharing our faith with the children of our parish.

Please consider leading the children. You gain as much from them as they do from you and there are many occasions to smile with some of their innocent comments and accounts.

I asked the children who they would like to pray for and one child said, "I want to pray for my nanny." I asked if she was ill. "No she's dead." I said, "Oh let's pray for her soul." "No she is out of her wheelchair and better now!" You see, miracles do happen in our parish!
