# 9<sup>th</sup> June 2024 Tenth Sunday of the Year (B) Psalter Week 2

"Bless me Father for I have sinned", sound familiar? "...it's been 3 months since my last confession, these are my sins...well actually I haven't committed any sins." "Goodness"! I reply – "please help me understand what you are doing here if you haven't committed any sins". "I'm not sure...".comes the answer. Such are the true confessions I have heard, no doubt my brother priests have heard similar.

What is going on here? Without being paranoid or self-defeating, are we really that sinless, for three months? We are fallible beings, aren't we?

I'm afraid the person is, probably unknowingly, committing a sin against the Holy Spirit that Jesus says can never be forgiven. And in the Confessional! The only unforgiveable sin is to believe we never sin, that we are that pure and perfect and don't really need mercy. If we don't think we need mercy, it won't be there. What is brought out into the light is forgiven.

Remember, our sins are not to evoke judgement and criticism, but simply naming a reality, naming it as it is. And it's true for all humanity.

Those things that fester in the murky deep darkness of our hearts will not be forgiven if they are not brought into the light. For Jesus, not bringing these things into the light is the work of the unclean spirit, cajoling us not to say anything for fear of embarrassment, loss of reputation or whatever. Keeping them well hidden. So they stay in the darkness, festering away.


What is revealed is redeemed. So we are called to own aspects of our own darkness. Acknowledge, admit, and name them. Then forgiveness happens. Isn't that what the Sacrament of Reconciliation is really about? Of course, we are also called to own our goodness there too. That can be much easier.

So the only sin that cannot be forgiven is the sin of believing we have never sinned. That we don't

need forgiveness and mercy. Therefore it won't happen. It can't happen.

Does our faith allow us to be strong enough to acknowledge what's really going on in our hearts – for good and for bad?
