# **OUR LADY OF RANSOM**

14th July 2024 Fifteenth Sunday of the Year

Psalter Week 3

Robert was deaf and dumb. The doctors said had the mind of a 2 year-old. We got on well, (I know, I'm just a two-year old at heart!!). Makaton sign language helped. Visiting him after a 6-month absence, I found out he had an illness which paralysed his legs. He needed a wheel-chair. Why! I quietly screamed at God. Then, horror of horrors, moments later I found out he had gone blind. Too much! God, where are you, again I agonisingly wondered. Something had to give. Desperately trying to get him to recognise me, I took his hands, moved them over my face — nothing. Frustrating. Then I remembered. I took his hands and gave him the "double-fives" we used to before I went away. YES! It worked. He screamed with joy, (so did I), he pulled me down to his wheelchair, hugging me tightly shouting his garbled hello, hello. Wow! Powerful .Moving. Where was God? God was in that moment. God was Robert, in all his vulnerability, dependency, weakness. The vulnerable Christ. No question.

I would periodically take Robert out in his wheelchair. Feeling the grass under his chair he'd attempt to articulate "grass". Also with "tree" and a few other words. Fantastic. Sadly the disease that ravaged his body took his life about a year later. He certainly left an indelible mark on my soul. Who really taught who? I offer this as truth, not as some kind of twee, sugary romanticism. I think of him often, and what he taught me about God, vulnerability, dependence, and joy, all despite having nothing.

I am certain Robert had a "pre-conscious" knowledge and experience of the divine. No formal teaching, but he knew. Maybe as a result of his vulnerability, his powerlessness. What else had he? (You can read Henri Nouwen's similar story with his friend Adam).

Nature made Robert that way. Why? Who knows? Yet in all that, from nothingness he gave much.

Most "mainstream" people have to harshly re-learn something through vulnerability or pure helplessness, to really experience the Lord's power. We tend to live lives of ingrained, routine- habits. I mentioned this last week. Jesus offers this voluntary vulnerability to his disciples today, pre-empting inflated egos and big-heads - and it works. They must be free and empty enough to allow God to work

through them, hence the forbidding of taking much with them. So God's power, can work through them, not their own agenda – so no inflated egos. Now, what about us? Where is, or was God in our own helplessness and/or vulnerability? That is finally where His power lies. How far are we prepared to empty ourselves to find His power? So it's not about us, but Him.


Get inspired by priests and parishioners as they share stories of transformation. Hear what they are learning and dream about the change that could be possible in your own parish.
