Psalter Week 3

Oh Jon, you're such a fool! Tall, lanky, he hardly spoke, except for the odd grunt of a 'yeh' or 'nuh'. He seemed to enjoy his roll-ups. Jon joined our group on a Catholic Students Retreat years ago. First impressions was that he was a fool. And there was Maria, petite, seemingly shy and withdrawn. A group of us were in a shop looking at some souvenirs, when suddenly the post-card stand went flying. Postcards everywhere. And there was Jon apologising profusely. Having picked up the cards, the lady shooed us out the shop. Disgusted with Jon's typical clumsiness, I (and the others) really wanted nothing to do with him. Walking in step with me, he muttered several times - 'I had to do it, I just had to do it'. I asked angrily 'do what Jon, do what?' He replied quietly, 'I pretended that I knocked the stand over and apologise; you see, Maria actually knocked it over, I was sure she would have died with embarrassment if everyone glared at and blamed her. So I took the blame'.

Suddenly I felt sick inside. Prejudices, criticisms, judgements. Such negative energies that can so emotionally and spiritually cripple us from seeing true goodness. Who was the real fool? And who was the enlightened one? I felt so ashamed. I apologised to Jon and he shrugged his shoulders. Just shrugged it off. What a wonderful man.

We all can tend to build walls around the heart to protect us from people who seem different. We make distinctions only on what we think we know, based on erroneous judgements These in turn fuel our pride and arrogance. Look at St. James' reading again. Jesus' healings are partly to eradicate all distinctions and prejudices in the community. Now fully restored back to the community - all prejudice and condescension is gone.

How do we solve this? Look into our own hearts, honestly, truthfully. What is 'really' going

on? Only when we are honest about our own weaknesses (and gifts) will be more in tune with others. Maybe hard, maybe embarrassing and maybe humiliating, but so spiritually strengthening. It's the way of love, the way of total inclusion. They are fools, but then so am I. They are talented and gifted, but then, so am I.


