Psalter Week 1

So embarrassing – failing exams. Especially when your friends do well. I know to my cost. Failing 'A' levels, so no university place. Felt so powerless. But thank God, one or two kind and wise people helped me along. I was told to try to find God and his will in this. I began to work with people with disabilities, while re-taking, and re-taking exams until I finally I got there. Not easy. I feel sure God wanted to introduce me to the world of disability, so I needed to fail, or no introduction. God was in my failure, my powerlessness, my pain. So real.

Jesus always sides with those whose lives are "failures". In fact, this is the perspective of the whole Bible. To read the Bible from the perspective of "establishment" is to completely miss the point. Just feel Jesus' frustration with his disciples as he is trying to teach them the way of powerlessness, the way of descent. They just don't get it. Too much for them, too much for us, if like them, we continue to look for status, trying to climb the ladder of success.

Interestingly, the philosopher Neitsche hated Jesus because of Jesus' teachings on powerlessness. He concluded, *European civilisation must be strong and powerful so it can triumph, we must be Supermen!* Then he said, *God is dead!* Whilst we do not agree with his conclusions, he understood Jesus. Yet Jesus' own disciples do not. Hitler came soon after Neitsche, followed his teachings, the rest we know. His disciples did not understand. Do we?

Jesus teaches that the only power we can trust is in those who have experienced powerlessness – learned from it, and found God right there. Some experience powerlessness and do not learn, they just ruminate on it and become twisted, angry and bitter all their lives. Jesus wishes for us to find meaning in these harsher moments of life. Hence the cross. In our powerlessness, God can really use us, not so if it is all about social climbing, status, success etc. No-one likes failure, descent. But that is where we find God. We all need one or two kind and wise friends to nurse us through. The disciples miss the point. Do we? Where in life do we feel rejected, inferior, hurt, betrayed and a failure. That

is where God can really be found. Would you rather listen to someone who is "powerful", or someone whose power comes through having experienced powerlessness and failure and then won through?

When we pray the Rosary calmly and meditatively, we can find remedies for any evils that may be lurking deep down within, and find the source of all blessing.

World Mission Sunday - 20th October, 2024

World Mission Sunday is a day that unites Catholics in every parish and every country. From the remote villages of Malawi to the rugged landscapes of Mongolia, faith communities like ours are getting to celebrate, pray and share whatever they can with our brothers and sisters in need. We stand united with them in prayer, solidarity and action.

On this Mission Sunday, Pope Francis reminds us of Christ's call to each one of us to 'go and invite everyone to the banquet'. And when he says 'everyone', he means everyone. Our mission is to be instruments of God's love, to share the Gospel; and our mission is not just local - it's global.

Missio is the Pope's charity for world mission, and he has entrusted the global Missio network with coordinating the World Mission Sunday celebration. Mission ensures that today's offerings- and those collected in parishes worldwide - reach communities in the greatest need. These are places where poverty, conflict, or the challenges of being a young Church create profound needs. Your generosity will help faith communities build their own chapels, fund hospitals, schools and support vocations where the Church is just beginning to take root or is struggling to survive.

To share a glimpse of your support's impact: In Lebanon, where families live under the constant threat of rockets and gunfire, the Sisters of the Forsaken Jesus are a beacon of hope. Sister Jovanna lives alongside struggling communities in Lebanon. She tells us, 'Our aim is to share love and care with families in real need. As long as we have food, we will share it and do everything we can to support them, preserving their dignity and hope'.

In Mongolia, home to the youngest Catholic Church in the world, the harsh winters can decimate the crops and herds the nomadic people rely on for survival. Missionaries there offer shelter, food and hope to those who have lost everything, whilst quietly sharing their faith. With your help, Missio has also played a key role in training lay catechists and the first Mongolian Priest, who alongside missionaries from around the world, provide education, healthcare and spiritual formation. They are inviting everyone to know God's love.

World Mission Sunday is a lifeline for thousands of missionaries like those in Lebanon and Mongolia, who bring Christ's love to some of the most challenging places in our world. These missionaries are often the first to respond in times of crisis and the last to leave the communities they serve. Today we give thanks for their tireless efforts as we share in their God-given mission to build a world of justice, peace and solidarity.

The essence of mission is to go out and invite others to share in the joy we receive through Christ's Resurrection. This joy isn't just for us; it is meant to be shared with the whole world. As Pope Francis reminds us the heart of our mission is to spread the Good News of God's love, which has the power to transform lives and heal our world.

As we gather around the Eucharistic table this World Mission weekend, let us remember that the poorest and most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters are the special quests at God's banquet. Together, let's respond to Christ's call to 'Go and invite everyone to the banquet'. Let's be the light and hope our world desperately needs, bearing witness to the love of Christ in all that we do.


