OUR LADY OF RANSOM

27th October 2024 Thirtieth Sunday of the Year Psalter Week 2

Are you successful? In what? How do you measure your success? Is it real – **really real?** What about the opposite, failure, rejection, enforced isolation? Have you experienced those? They happen today, often at a much more sophisticated and subtle level than long ago.

Abraham Lincoln said that success is not so much about our achievements, but, rather, going from failure to failure without losing enthusiasm. He also said that success is not measured by accomplishments, but by the opposition we encounter and the courage we maintain in struggling against it. What a great definition! This is the stuff of biblical Hope. A blind man in Jesus' day was at the bottom of the social heap. No influence whatsoever in social life. Massive opposition from others in trying to silence him. But look at his courage, his nitty-gritty faith. The odds were stacked against him. So his hope was kept alive though his faith.

Maybe a brazenness, a shamelessness born out of a real faith that gave him incredible hope. A kind of stubborn courage to carry on shouting after Jesus. Hope is often having this solid faith when worldly odds seem stacked against us. People trying to silence him obviously working against him. He was a man of Hope, Hope, born out of faith.

When all is said and done, words are cheap. In the raw, nitty-gritty situations of our lives, when we feel ground down, at our wits end, rejected, a failure – and we say *Just how long can I go on for? How long 'must' I go on for?!*Yet with all that, our faith and hope must be something real – that is what keeps us going, so often against the odds. Not just human will-power or determination (which eventually fail us), but a faith that is firmly rooted in God's love and strength. Just as in Bartimaeus, the blind man. Faith is always about allowing and empowering another, including God himself, to be everything he or she can be for us. That's the faith in God we are called to live, a faith that always wins out – so often, despite the odds against us. Not easy. If our faith is to help and strengthen us, it needs to be a stubborn faith that will not give up, a real faith inside those nitty-gritty harsher moments of




