10th November 2024 32nd Sunday of the Year (Remembrance Sunday) Psalter Week 4

"Please sir, my friend hasn't come back from the battlefield. Permission to go and look for him....?" "Permission denied", said the officer, "I don't want you to risk your life for a man who is probably dead". The young soldier went anyway, and staggered back an hour later, himself struggling from mortal wounding, agonisingly carrying his friend's body. "I told you he may be dead. Now I've quite possibly lost both of you. Tell me, was it worth going to bring back a dead body?" "Oh yes, more than worth it, sir. When I got there he was still alive, and he said to me, 'Ian, I knew you'd come".

No explanation needed. Today we honour, salute, thank, and pay tribute to those who have fallen in all wars. We remember and are inspired by their extraordinary bravery, heroism and martyrdoms. And as people of the Resurrection, our faith must be that they are in a very real way, alive, at peace, and with us. With us to inspire and give us fresh hope. With us to urge us, to scream at us, *stop, enough is enough.* Their deaths remind us of the evils of war. Lives heroically sacrificed so we back here should learn a valuable lesson about these evils, angers, griefs and terrors that war promotes. Its venom of bitterness biting into our very souls, creating chaos, agony and turmoil. And from their risen lives, they call us to stop, continually urging peace. Do we listen?

Yes, a war may end; but for survivors, the war rages on in their hearts, into their marriages, children and into future generations.

All this because greedy people want more and more land and power; or maybe because some are threatened by people who seem different. So they try to forcefully control, or annihilate; all to dispose of this 'threatening' group. Such greedy power games can start small, then mushroom, as history so clearly shows us. If only people were more like the poor widow in today's Gospel, humble and true. True to themselves. Things may well be very different. But do we learn?

We are one race, the human race. No-one need feel stigmatised. Creed, colour, finance, we are all one. Hypocrites we see today are trying to divide what is already one. Dividing, and more dividing. It

goes on... Why can't people be more like the poor widow? A poor widow, yet rich in love. In God's eyes, we are all rich. We are all one.

We remember. We salute and are inspired by those who fell. From their risen life we hear them scream, *enough is enough. Why must more die so agonisingly? Aren't our deaths enough for all to learn? So stop it! Peace is the only way.* And we realise just how right Jesus is all the way along. What will it take for everyone to finally learn?


