OUR LADY OF RANSOM



17th November 2024 33rd Sunday of the Year (World Day of the Poor) Psalter Week 1

You may be 38 years old as I happen to be. And one day some great opportunity stands before you and calls you to stand for some great principle, some great issue, some great cause. And you refuse to do it because you are afraid...you refuse to do it because you want to live longer...you're afraid that you will lose your job, or that you will be criticised, or you will lose your popularity or someone will stab you, shoot you or bomb your house...so you refuse to take a stand. Well, you may go on to live until you are 90, but you are just as dead at 38 as you would be at 90. And the cessation of breathing in your life is but the belated announcement of an earlier death of the spirit. (Rev. Dr. Martin Luther-King Jnr).

The above is part of a wonderful speech of his. A man with an amazingly prophetic voice. Shot dead because he prophetically stood for a worthy cause and the establishment felt threatened by him, as with so many prophets. He had a great passion for life, justice and truth. We are all called to share this passion. To make our lives count. To live lives as fulfilled as possible. Those who live largely fulfilled lives are far less frightened of dying. Remember, fear and faith are biblical opposites.

Darkened suns and moons, stars falling, heaven being shaken - are cataclysms that happen in the human heart when our lives remain so unfulfilled. Death of the Spirit as Dr. King says, or more simply, we are already dead. Maybe something happens calling us for the chance to allow greater fulfilment. Do we rise to it as he suggests? Do we see the signs, as Jesus suggests? The more frightened we are, the more unfulfilled our lives remain.

Many fundamentalist Christians will see Jesus' comments about these worldly cataclysms, darkened suns and falling stars as very literal. Surely, more importantly, we are called to be concerned about living life now. Avoid cataclysms and darkness of the heart. Those who live life now are not so preoccupied with death, life-after-death, and external, worldly cataclysms. They know that life-afterdeath just happens. Why? Because they have fulfilment now. If you have it now, why would you not

have it later? How we are now, is how we are later. So it is the <u>now</u> that counts.

Please do not worry about whether there is life-afterdeath. Worry more about whether we have a full and real life-before-death.


