#### Christ the King

#### Psalter Week 2

Six years of training for the Priesthood in Rome allowed me to study books, journals, papers, articles. Studying our faith tradition - theology, philosophy. Reasoned, logical and intellectual arguments. Great stuff, interesting stuff. All good and necessary towards "knowing a lot" about the faith. But "living it out?" That's a different question. Our beliefs are so much more about a relationship and a following that evolves into faith and trust. Something deeply personal, <u>never private</u>. Just as we cannot do love any real justice only by being "logical, philosophical or intellectual", so, neither can we about faith, trust and relationship.

We begin to realise that Jesus becomes a way of living. Jesus is Jesus because he is the second person of the Blessed Trinity. To remove him from the Trinity (as many seem to do) is to do Him great injustice. He then simply becomes God – only to be worshiped – "Jesus" becomes just another name for God. We totally lose his humanity. Hence the world has created so many "unchristian Christians". And Christmas becomes devoid of meaning. Incarnation, human flesh. No wonder Christmas is so "hyped up". Rather, we are called to form a relationship and follow his Humanity. Historically it seems people have been taught more to "say their prayers, go to church, go to confession". That becomes ingrained and 'all we need'. No wonder so many 'so-called Christians' act no differently to anyone else.

Frequently Jesus refers to himself as the "Son of Man", not just Son of God. Son of Man, the Human One, (see last week's Scriptures). The "everyman". Jesus becomes the one who represents everyone, the personification, the archetype, prototype human who sums up in himself what God is doing everywhere and all through history. Jesus is what humanity is at its best. Jesus is humanity all coalesced into one small moment – 33 years in Palestine, 2000 years ago. He is the blueprint of what God is doing through all history - the first image, in this way he is our King. He becomes the ultimate and safe reference point so we all have access to what it is to be truly human, and therefore divine.

He is one of us, 'leading the great parade' as St. Paul says - the great parade is us. The best thing we can do is develop a relationship and follow his path. Many times he says "follow me". Yet people are too content with only worshipping His divinity, rather than following His Humanity. Any wonder we create so many unchristian Christians! Maybe **following** is more challenging. Today Jesus declares Himself the King. So **follow** Christ the King. That's what gives life, and it always leads us to the divine.

The term of office is for four years from the date of appointment.


Foundation Governors are personally appointed by the Bishop to Diocesan schools to represent his interests and those of the Catholic community as a whole.

Anyone interested in the role and mission of Foundation Governor should not be put off by a lack of experience. Appropriate training is available during the period of service.




