Circle of friends chatting in the pub. Laughter. On this occasion one regular member of the group is absent. Someone has a "pop" at him in his absence. More laughter. Another jumps on the bandwagon. Increased laughter. Before long, they are all in unconscious competition to see who can create the most laughter with the wittiest stab-in-the-back, of course, at the cost of his reputation - the absent friend. *Leave him alone*, eventually retorts one member of the group, *he's not here to defend himself. So unfair. 'Don't be a damp squid, you're spoiling all the fun'*, he was told.

Be careful of friendships that go only a pint deep. Sound advice I was once offered.

This "scapegoating", making another person the object of ridicule, so as they suffer our own pains has a long history. It's mostly done unconsciously. It happens in individuals, groups, nations and internationally. It can give a real sense of solidarity. Laughing together at someone else's expense. We make someone else an enemy, even temporarily through venting our self-hatreds on to that person. Why? Because people are too spiritually immature and weak to face their own issues within themselves. Someone else has to pay the price. Psychiatrists, psychologists, including Jesus, all teach the same thing. Maybe the most mature member of the group above was the "damp squib".


It is very easy to round up the troops with common hatreds. It brings a false sense of unity. No depth. Just a pint deep. Gossip has similar power. This is why people "love" a bit of "goss". But to round up the troops in the way of love – that is a far different cry. More challenging. Yet it's central to the Gospel, to our lives as Christians. But true Christianity is challenging – never easy.

Jesus, one of the greatest "holistic" teachers ever, reminds us of the need to love "holistically", with all our hearts, minds, souls and strength. This must include embracing the negative side of ourselves, the stuff maybe we'd prefer to hide – otherwise we will

undoubtedly scapegoat others. Jesus on the cross becomes the greatest scapegoat of all time. Paying a price because people are too immature to pay the price in themselves. Jesus settles the price once and for all, so we would stop scapegoating each other.

Are our relationships only a pint deep? Or, are we in touch with the stuff deep down, stuff maybe we would rather hide – is our love as holistic as Jesus wishes? Is that love bringing authentic unity?




