Psalter Week 3

Come Lord Jesus, shake the tired foundations of our crumbling institutions, breathe upon our troubled world. Break the rules that keep you out of all our sacred spaces and institutions, and from the dust and rubble, gather up the seedlings of a new creation.

Come Lord Jesus, enflame once more the dying embers of our weariness. Shake us out of our complacency. Whisper our names once more, and scatter your gifts of grace with wild abandon. Break open the prisons of our inner being, and let your raging justice be our sign of liberty.

Come Lord Jesus, lead us to places we would rather not go. Expand the horizons of our limited imaginations. Awaken in our souls dangerous dreams for a new tomorrow, rekindle in our hearts the fire of prophetic enthusiasm.

Come Lord Jesus, your justice outwits international conspiracy, your light outshines religious bigotry, your peace can halt our patriarchal hunger for dominance and control, your promise invigorates our every effort: to create a new heaven and a new earth, now and forever. (Diarmuid O'Murchu - slightly adapted).

Shaking foundations, breaking rules, awakening to dangerous dreams – rocking the boat and making waves. Radical stuff. Do we like these people? Or would we rather our little securities and comforts? Diarmuid's prayer describes John the Baptist's kind of thinking: a man of raging justice and dangerous dreams. Disturbing the comfortable, comforting the disturbed. And Jesus follows John's radical and revolutionary teachings. He takes them to new dimensions, new depths and new horizons eg. 'love your enemies'. Can we follow this <u>real revolutionary Jesus</u>?

It is these radical people who will co-create a new heaven and new earth, <u>they</u> will save and transform our world and make it a better, happier and more unthreatening place. Comfort and security lovers will do little, they are often too self-centred, they tend to be boring creatures of habit, set in their ways who will never grow the world up – because they never grow up themselves.

How radical are we prepared to be in following this <u>real Jesus</u> so as we can take our part in transforming this world into a better, happier and more unthreatening place?


