Psalter Week 4

Six year old Billy was in the restaurant with his parents and asked if he could say grace. Bowing their heads Billy said, *God is good. God is great. Thank you God for the food, and I would thank you even more if I could have ice-cream. And peace to the world. Amen.* Customers around laughed. Except one elderly woman who remarked: "what's wrong with this country, children don't even know how to pray. Fancy asking God for ice-cream, really!" Hearing this Billy burst out crying. "is God angry with me, what did I do wrong, he asked?" As his mum and dad were reassuring him, an elderly man approached. He winked at little Billy, and said in Billy's ear that he happened to know that God thought it was a great prayer. "Really?" said Billy. "Cross my heart," said the man. Then gently pointing to the woman he said " its too bad *she* never asks God for ice-cream. A little ice-cream is good for the soul". Winking again, he walked away. His parents bought Billy some ice-cream. Billy stared at the ice-cream, picked up the plate, and without a word, placed it in front of the woman. With a big smile he told her, "this is for you. Ice-cream is good for the soul, you need it, my soul is good already".

What is good for our soul? What moves our soul? Will this Christmas affect us deeply in a new way? Or will it be just another Christmas - business as usual? Do we listen to the movements of our souls? This is the stuff of prayer. Mary listens to her soul, the deeper resonances going on inside, she had no-one in authority to talk to, to check the validity of her intuitions. She simply trusted her deeper intuitions. What an example to us. The Angel Gabriel will have spoken to Mary's soul. Trusting in his dreams suggests Joseph was listening to his own deeper intuitions too. His soul. No rationale, no logic explains all this — only faith. Authentic faith allows us to do some amazing things, and we can even amaze ourselves. Will we allow that possibility? Will we allow this Christmas to affect us more deeply than usual? Will we let it

change us in some way, always for the better?


Please God Christmas will bring us all every blessing, and this coming New Year will bring us all that is good. May I wish you all every peace and all good for Christmas and this coming New Year.






