As she passed us, she smiled the most beautiful serene smile, as if to say, welcome - all is well. I wonder sometimes if that would happen here.

Epiphany of the Lord

In a moment of time, I sensed that this lady was filled with life, respect and reverence. A respect for all around her, despite her challenges. I feel sure we gave her the same respect back with a least an equally courteous smile.

Maybe this lady is not a professed Christian. So? She can still know truth. Yes, I suspect she does. Truth is always of God. Today's feast reminds us that Christ is manifest to everyone. Everyone. No exceptions. The star over Bethlehem and St Paul are making the same point - Christ is universal. Christ is Cosmic. God is observed wherever people are genuinely searching for truth, goodness, love and light. No religion or group will ever control that search. You will find sincere, loving and generous Christ-filled hearts in every country and religion - be they professed Christians or not.

Many people may not have the word 'Christ' as such, but they have surely entered into the Christmystery, that Jesus the Christ is the living image for all history for us to follow. Such people are certainly following the Christ-way, without necessarily professing his name – the way of total love, respect, compassion and reverence etc.

So it was for the wise men. Pagans, sorcerers, magi (where we get the word magic), new-agers, on a long arduous search for truth. Wise men, kings, non-Jews, at the top of the social strata; and shepherds – at the bottom. Christ is there for everyone, irrespective how we actually name him. He is there irrespective of who or where we are socially or otherwise. Wise men who seek the truth, a truth that will always be bigger than any petty-minded religious or tribal thinking.

As we begin this new year, can we be like the wise men, be wise women and men seeking truth, light, goodness and love wherever it may be found? How much bother are we prepared to go to, like the wise men, in order to find that truth?





