Politicians. To be trusted or not? Why? Why not? Many will say too many promises and manifestos are easily broken. Many say they are in it for solely their own benefits. Maybe, to all that. Maybe not.

Today Jesus produces his manifesto. He has called his disciples, and now summarises what he will preach, setting out his vision. Often called the "Sermon on the Mount". Jesus is saying that if we have had a glimpse or experience of God, these teachings will make total sense. If not, then we probably still have a way to go.

The difference between Jesus and any politician is that Jesus lives out his manifesto, lives out his vision, lives out his promises in every sense, in his very body. It's called the "Beatitudes". Ghandi thought that these Beatitudes were Jesus' "piece de resistance". He got it. Many do not, they yawn and skip over it. Pious platitudes? No! Be poor now, so you will be happy in the next world? No - absolutely not! Jesus' equivalent to the Ten Commandments - definitely not! And definitely not a list of laws to uphold.

Something hugely deeper. Too threatening for many, so it is avoided. In this vision, Jesus is subverting the whole social world order, turning everything as previously understood upside down for a new world order. Too threatening to anyone who wants to climb the ladder of success, wealth, and power – or if already at the top. Often better to pretend it is just a piece of nice rhetoric, or nice poetry –or that "Jesus didn't really say that", or "we have misunderstood". All this keeps us unthreatened. Sorry, but he did say it and intended it to be threatening – Jesus always tries to de-stabilise our previous way of thinking and replace it with a totally upside-down new kind of meaning. It's called transformation.

In short, Jesus is saying that those who are not unhealthily attached to worldly things, like prestige, power, possessions, money, self – satisfaction, personal reputation – such people are the fortunate ones, for they are free enough to experience God in their lives. Such worldly things are not coming between themselves and God, as Jeremiah suggests, so they know true happiness – directly from God. Jesus lives this truth out in his life, to the very end. No compromise. How much can we live this truth?

How blessed (happy/fortunate) are you, when you are not addicted to the things of the world, so are free enough to fully let God into your life and follow his will – then you will know true happiness.

<u>From Fr. Gerald..</u> | read in last week's Parish newsletter that the Coffee Morning after Mass was for the "Mduduzi Family Care" Project, which operates in the Township of Embalenhle in South Africa.

I would like to THANK EVERYONE who supported the Coffee Morning so generously, and clearly with much love, joy and enthusiasm - and with the most delicious cakes, the Wonderful CHILDREN whose initiative it was. I thank you on behalf of everyone in the Mduduzi Family Care Project -

I was impressed by ALL the young people and children, and of course their parents, but there are always one or two who are inspired and speak up with an idea! James and Daniel asked me about my work and I am told you two were the inspiration for the Coffee Morning for the Project. Thank you, and for the support you rallied

Briefly: Mduduzi Family Care was formed over 20 years ago to care for the sick and dying children and their parents who had AIDS, because at that time there was no cure or any kind of medicine available to us. When a child died we would use a vegetable box for the coffin and wrap the body in a lovely colourful blanket and bury them by the shack where they lived.

We gradually found ourselves with many many orphaned children so this then became

the work of the Mduduzi Family Care to take in and look after any children, babies, or young people with no Mum or Dad or family to love and care for them. At the moment in 2025 we have 84 children and six main Carers. It all runs smoothly and happy as the local community is involved - there is a saying that "the child belongs to the family and to the Village" The members in the Mduduzi Family Care are told of all donations made, and the Donors, so all are in their prayers. Thank you all again.

#### What does a Foundation Governor do?

Foundation Governors are appointed by the Bishop Alan to represent his education policy in the school. They preserve and develop the Catholic ethos of the school.

As a Foundation Governor, you are a member of a governing body, which is a corporate team. The governing body works with the headteacher to set high expectations and drive school improvement with a focus on:

- preserving and developing the Catholic character of the school on behalf of Bishop Alan
- setting the vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school
- holding the headteacher and leadership team to account
- overseeing the financial performance of the school

What are the time commitments?

The average Foundation Governor role will take up to 10 hours a term including attending one governing body meeting per term and, typically, serving on one committee. You will need to be able to attend meetings regularly and have time to read the paperwork and get to know the school well.

You are also expected to demonstrate commitment to fulfilling your role responsibly through your ongoing training and development. A range of governor training, including Induction and on-line learning, are available through the Diocese.


