Psalter Week 3

Are you serious, Jesus? What! That's crazy! No way! Love your enemy! Do good to those who hate you. Bless those who curse you. Pray for those who abuse you... If you only knew what that person has done to me...what they've put me through...

Again, like last week, unless we have had some glimpse or experience of the divine, our reaction will something akin to the above. Jesus only begins to make some kind of sense once we have experienced the divine in some way.

What does this forgiveness stuff really mean? Certainly not the superficial *I'll forgive but not forget* piece of nonsense we often hear. To forgive is to forget, to let go of (ie forgetting) the emotional hurt so we feel liberated. We remember in our minds, but the emotional pain has been let go of, forgotten.

Again, we think maybe of someone being big-hearted saying it's all forgiven. That can be an act of condescension. Big-hearted me! In forgiving, we are not called to look big-hearted, magnanimous or just a nice person. This can demean the other person, and often doesn't make them feel better about themselves. They just see you as being big-hearted in forgiving and feel inferior. Jesus calls us to go deeper.

Forgiveness is about affirming the person, believing in them once again so you help bring out their best selves. Truly believing in another person through forgiveness can prevent that person being destroyed by self-hatred. It helps them recover their self-worth. See how forgiveness takes a great act of love, not duty or big-heartedness. But then words are cheap, actions are another story... but we must be open enough to allow God's power in to let forgiveness happen.

This forgiving, the real way, can make us look like fools to the unwise, yet it restores the other person. It's Jesus' forgiveness from the cross. Not looking very good, in his broken, bleeding dying body, yet redeeming us all, granting us our dignity and self-worth as children of God.

So forgiveness is much more than just big-heartedness or duty. And of course, so difficult. We see why we need to have had that glimpse or experience of the divine – to <u>really</u> forgive. It really is loving the enemy. And we see how true forgiveness can bring about real transformation and healing in the other

person, the enemy, the hated one. That's the nature of

God's forgiveness. Can it be ours?

<u>From Fr. Gerald..</u> | read in the Parish newsletter that the Coffee Morning after Mass was for the "Mduduzi Family Care" Project, which operates in the Township of Embalenhle in South Africa.

I would like to THANK EVERYONE who supported the Coffee Morning so generously, and clearly with much love, joy and enthusiasm - and with the most delicious cakes, the Wonderful CHILDREN whose initiative it was. I thank you on behalf of everyone in the Mduduzi Family Care Project -

I was impressed by ALL the young people and children, and of course their parents, but there are always one or two who are inspired and speak up with an idea! James and Daniel asked me about my work and I am told you two were the inspiration for the Coffee Morning for the Project. Thank you, and for the support you rallied

Briefly: Mduduzi Family Care was formed over 20 years ago to care for the sick and dying children and their parents who had AIDS, because at that time there was no cure or any kind of medicine available to us. When a child died we would use a vegetable box for the coffin and wrap the body in a lovely colourful blanket and bury them by the shack where they lived.

We gradually found ourselves with many many orphaned children so this then became the work of the Mduduzi Family Care to take in and look after any children, babies, or young people with no Mum or Dad or family to love and care for them. At the moment in 2025 we have 84 children and six main Carers. It all runs smoothly and happy as the local community is involved - there is a saying that "the child belongs to the family and to the Village" The members in the Mduduzi Family Care are told of all donations made, and the Donors, so all are in their prayers. Thank you all again.

What does a Foundation Governor do?

Foundation Governors are appointed by the Bishop Alan to represent his education policy in the school. They preserve and develop the Catholic ethos of the school.

As a Foundation Governor, you are a member of a governing body, which is a corporate team. The governing body works with the headteacher to set high expectations and drive school improvement with a focus on:

- preserving and developing the Catholic character of the school on behalf of Bishop Alan
- setting the vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school
- holding the headteacher and leadership team to account
- overseeing the financial performance of the school

What are the time commitments?

The average Foundation Governor role will take up to 10 hours a term including attending one governing body meeting per term and, typically, serving on one committee. You will need to be able to attend meetings regularly and have time to read the paperwork and get to know the school well.

You are also expected to demonstrate commitment to fulfilling your role responsibly through your ongoing training and development. A range of governor training, including Induction and on-line learning, are available through the Diocese.


