OUR LADY OF RANSOM

30th March 2025 4th Sunday of Lent (C)

Psalter Week 4

Wise old Fr. Makarios lived alone on the mountain. A young priest visiting asked, do you still fight with the devil? "No, I used to" he answered, "but now I've grown old and tired, and the devil has grown old and tired with me, I leave him alone, and he leaves me alone". So your life must be easy now? "No, far more difficult, for now I fight with God". You fight with God and expect to win? "No", said the wise old priest, "I expect to lose, and God to win".

So true for us all. The extraordinary story of the Prodigal Son illustrates so beautifully the above, with the two great struggles in life. In our early years we fight the devil, fighting powerful, chaotic, urgent energies and impulses - all driving and tempting us on to do wild things like the younger son in today's parable. Money, identity, status, ambition, hormones, prestige, all sorts of struggles happen. Later in life, a second struggle begins, now, with God. And with God, really speaking, we can only lose.

In early years, many wounds can often be concealed within this zest for life. As the years roll by, these wounds break through. The betrayals, hurts, abuses, angers all surface. Now a new struggle begins to let go, forgive – everything - family, church, jobs, bosses, nation, even forgive God because life has been so unfair. We see how we are now fighting God. Not so easy. Those who let go, forgive, those who do their grief-work, they are the ones who grow old gracefully, mellow-out, become wise. To not let go is the stuff of the older son in the parable. His anger, bitterness and resentment all surface. His obedience and loyalty are duty, not love. Now he fights the father (God). Can he 'really' beat God? He holds on, showing no love. The father (God) begs him to let go, forgive, love – "come to the party (heaven)... your son was dead and is alive....all I have is yours". Shouldn't all that make him happy? Will



this older son die a happy or bitter old man? The younger son sinks lower than the low (hell) in wanting his father dead (give me my share...), content to eat pigs' husks, (what's a good Jewish boy doing with pigs and their husks? - urgh!) – but gets sensible, and is forgiven – no questions, just a party (heaven).

Us too. God's forgiveness is wildly unconditional. He <u>begs</u> us to experience that truth so we can forgive others in turn. Finally, peace. Do we hold on and stay bitter, or get sensible like the younger son, and let God win by letting go, forgiving, and finding peace?



The Shroud of Turin is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front & back of a crucified man - believed by many to be the actual burial Shroud used to wrap the body of Our Lord after his crucifixion, & upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted.


