# **OUR LADY OF RANSOM**

18th May 2025 Fifth Sunday of Easter C

**Psalter Week 4** 



Ouch! That hard slap on the back from an Italian policeman really stung. St Mark's Square in Venice, the man was firmly telling me to put my shirt back on; then a near fatal car-crash in France, as well as meeting wonderful people in all the various European countries, sampling great food, and seeing great sites – I thought my trip around Europe was great. And in those days, I was arguably ahead of many of my contemporaries in terms of travel.

Today, young people are travelling the whole globe - gap-years or work-related. It pales my earlier trips rather into insignificance. Foreign places are so much more accessible today. Years on I have travelled a little further, and I realize and experience just how 'global' we really are.

Whether it's travel, skype, facetime or TV, we now know we are a global village. There are in fact other religions, cultures, ethnicities and worldviews – and they are now 'in our faces'. The world has shrunk. Years ago, we could afford to be much more insular in our thinking, small thinking, we could live in denial of other peoples since they weren't so much in our faces. We could believe that God loved and saved only Catholics (or whatever we professed to be). Today's 'globalization' makes us aware that God is for everyone, not just ourselves. We all stand on this one globe; mother-earth feeds us all. We all breathe the same air and rely on the same sun. This is a foundational truth taking us beyond any ideologies. We are universally and primarily members of this one earth community. Today we know it is for real.

Could this part of St. John's exotic imagery and poetic language (in our second reading from Revelation)? Is John prophetically seeing a new world order (that Jesus himself often proclaims) in this 'globalization'? A global community that encourages us to completely turn around any narrow-minded, insular worldview. Especially a small narrow worldview from years ago. Is he seeing a new social order, the *Kingdom of God? The Reign of God?* Is this something beyond any logic?

Pie-in-the-sky? No. Idealistic? No. Those who are open to, and personally experience God's overwhelming love, *they* see this vision partly happening right now, *they* live it, *they know* one-day his will, will be fulfilled, or is now being fulfilled – everywhere and for all time. Do we have that kind of vision?



# The Sacrament of Confirmation.

A FEW DAYS LEFT. We are inviting all young people who wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to come along on Monday June 9<sup>th</sup> to begin a series of sessions leading to the receiving of the Sacrament on Sunday November 16<sup>th</sup> from Bishop Alan. All sessions will begin at 7pm. The first few will be on a Monday evening, the rest will be on a Wednesday evening. Timetables will be given out on June 9<sup>th</sup>. You need to be in Year 9 or above (or in year 8 when we begin) in order to receive the Sacrament. Full commitment to these sessions is expected as is regular ongoing Practice of the Faith.

Please, in the first instance, <u>BY THE END OF MAY</u>, write a letter to Fr. Paul clearly stating the <u>reasons why</u> you wish to receive the Sacrament. Be sure to include contact details. Thank you.

- 4 people successfully moved on into independent living
