Sixth Sunday of Easter C

Sixteen-year-old Andrew had had a serious back operation. He was off school for several months. He made a grand entrance into class on his first day back, the applause and delight of his friends was electric. Tears of sheer joy. But Andrew was now confined to a wheelchair. And yet, like so many of the youngsters with special needs that I worked with – no way did it get him down. His joy was infectious.

Always happy despite setbacks. Like so many of my students, I firmly believe many of them were in touch with the Holy Spirit living within. They were connected. Many of us others can be so distracted – finances, exams, schools, making a living, life's problems – we lose focus. Understandably so. But Jesus reminds us that God has planted a bit of himself in all of us that yearns for its source - we call it the 'Holy Spirit'. It needs re-discovering. It is there. Like a 'homing device' living within, the spirit agonizingly longs to 'home-in' or return to himself - God. Giving in to worldly distractions, the more unfulfilled we stay - the more unconnected we are. Painful. No focus. Confusion. The homingdevice is not homing-in! At times of difficulty in life, surely this is the best and most appropriate time to try and reconnect or re-discover this living presence within, so we find some peace and joy even in these difficult times of life.

I sense that many of my young friends I taught, who live without many of our 'customary' distractions, were far more in touch and connected with this 'homing-device', the Holy Spirit. It therefore allowed them to 'home-in' to God, hence their constant joy. It can be ours too. We need to make contact within. Re-discover this "homing device" that has always been there. Challenging, it's the stuff of real prayer – to re-connect, re-discover and find great joy.

Jesus clearly wants us to re-connect, re-discover this Holy Spirit alive and active within all of us, so we can be filled with His joy.

Without being in touch, remaining disconnected, prayer becomes a functional, selfish agenda. Church becomes a problem-solving, practical, brownie point system. The Sacraments become strategies for school-entry and ticking boxes. The Bible becomes ammunition for an 'I am right' scenario. Authority becomes domination. Politics becomes control and power, and religion becomes a membership system defining who's in or out. Is that really the work of the Holy Spirit? Of course not.

However, *inside the Holy Spirit, ie. being connected,* prayer becomes an intimate union with God to be relished. Church becomes a place that is a real life-giving vibrant community. The Sacraments become authentic manifestations of what is going on within and so make total sense. The Bible becomes totally inclusive. Authority becomes servanthood. Politics becomes leadership through example, and religion becomes 're-ligios' – re-binding or reconciling us back to God - immense joy. A true re-discovery, re-connection. We see why the Holy Spirit makes all the difference, and why Jesus wants us to be in touch. Are we prepared to at least try to re-connect, rediscover this living presence within?


