Sexual equality. Major issue today. Could Jesus have already been promoting this 2000 years ago? Today's Gospel gives us a hint that this might just be true. And it's taken us that amount of time to recognise its integrity and enshrine it in law. Wow!

In Jesus' day, and, arguably, until quite recently, it was the "man's" role to listen and discuss theology, politics and putting the world to rights! Women's roles were to focus more on domestic issues. It seems that Jesus is saying that women can just as correctly listen to and discuss the bigger things as men can. Mary has broken into an "all-male" group by listening and maybe discussing with Jesus these bigger issues of life. For Jesus, Mary has chosen the better part. Is promoting sexual equality going on here?

Martha wants Jesus to reinforce her cultural conditioning and understanding of women's roles – domestic help in the kitchen, (and getting agitated), which Jesus clearly refuses.

So, is Jesus pushing sexual equality all those years ago? He may well be giving similar hints elsewhere in the Gospels. If so, why has it taken us about 2000 years to appreciate this and finally enshrine it in law? We begin to realise how far Jesus was ahead of His time – and ours. Undoubtedly there is a great deal more that Jesus taught, and we are only just beginning to really appreciate. Quite exciting.

Mary has chosen the cultural "male" role in listening and discussing. This is certainly a brave break-through 2000 years ago. Listening is so important. Listening to God. Listening to our deeper resonances. Many are too frightened because of what they may find deep down – so they don't bother. Oops!

A quick story. A woman was in an empty church alone. Head in her hands. The priest saw her and walked past. A little later she was still there, head in hands. Again, he walked past. A little later, the priest became concerned, gently touched her shoulder and asked if she needed help. "I'm getting all the help I need" she answered.

We are human **BE**-ings, **not** human **DO**-ings. We get agitated about doing, "have I done this right; I can do this, not sure I can do that ..." we forget to simply 'be', so we lose a sense of who we are, it can be then so easy to crack-up. To be, to give ourselves time to listen to the deeper resonances within is crucial to finding a sense of balance, reconnecting with the real and well-being. It further allows us to focus, seek God, and find a sense of who we really are. It must be the better part. How can it not be? Otherwise, everything we do will come from an un-enlightened heart. No wonder we can get so agitated and lose the plot and others along with us end up paying a price. As I just said...oops! Not good.

So, do our actions come from an enlightened heart? Is Jesus pushing sexual equality all those years ago? Did we miss


