Words found on a wall by the Allied Forces after the Second World War, where people were hiding. Pure faith.

The total opposite to faith is not unbelief, but fear, anxiety, worry. How much do we worry? This is why 365 times we read the words 'do not worry, do not be afraid'. Have faith. We worry about the vanities we heard about last week, things that are not eternal. Without such faith we are going to be overly concerned with management, materialistic and security questions. Without a faith that knows God is for us, we will be totally self-preoccupied. In fact, it would be silly not to be. Self-preoccupation. We become self-centred, the centre of our own universe.

Maybe this is part of our problem today. So many do not have a God they can have faith in, so naturally there will be a sense of over self-preoccupation. This of course leads to huge individualism and selfishness. For these people, there is no God to hold it all together. Such worries so many people carry on their own shoulders easily lead to violent thoughts and possibly violent actions. With people's such lack of faith today, is it surprising we live in such an unsettled world?

But our God has taken these worries from us. That's our loving God. So, we do not need to worry. Nor grovel, nor try to earn God's approval, we have it already. God loves us unconditionally. Our own love and goodness flow freely and enduringly from this realisation.

Now we understand why Jesus says the things he does today. Basically, ask yourself the question: *where do I spend my time and money?* That is where my treasure is. The focus of our time and money will say something about what our God is and what is important to us. Maybe our flexible friends and diaries reveal what our real beliefs are.

So, we are not to worry. God is not out to catch us out. But like last week's message, we are called to live life now. That is God's joy. That is what we were created for. No to miss out. Live, enjoy, choose each moment. In other words, as the great prophet said, do not be afraid of dying, be more afraid of not having lived. Or as Jack said several times in the film 'Titanic', *make it count*. There are no threats about the future, but an invitation to live *now*. Maybe re-read this Gospel (Luke 12: 35-48) and see if you appreciate it in an entirely new way.


