Psalter Week 4



Matt joined a photography club. He liked it. The people in the club were quite nice and helpful, he thought. But a more sinister evil was lurking beneath this niceness. All the members unanimously hated the club just up the road, a club which took in many ex-prisoners. Everyone in the club would think they were violent or plain nasty, and so were concerned, or just simply scared. Sam, who knew the feelings of the people in this photography club, as well as the good work going on up the road, offered to take volunteers to go and see and meet these ex-prisoners. Some agreed to go and were very pleased with what they saw. Not a hint of violence or nastiness; absolutely no need to be concerned. Simply a group of people who honorably wanted to turn their lives around. Returning to the photography club, the volunteers tried to reassure the other members of how good this club was, and how decent these ex-offenders were. Some others agreed and wanted to go and see for themselves too, others just angrily refused. This next group that went were equally pleased with what they saw, and they tried to reassure the others. More were beginning to really appreciate what was going on in the club up the road, many others continued their angry refusal.

Of course, a split happened in the photography club, between those who would stick their heels in, and those who grew to like the ex-offenders club and what was being done. They wanted to invite them to their photography club.

A split, a division happened all because of Sam's good work. His good work brought a sword and division, but division where there is hatred. A fire which would hopefully burn up this unwarranted hatred.

In the same way, similar splits happen because of Jesus' good work too, as He says, even inter-generational splits within families. Especially where families, clubs or groups hold together because of common hatred and intolerance (eg. the photography club). Many will want what Jesus offers, and bring it to others, who will like what is happening, many, on the other hand, will foolishly stick their heels in.

Solidarity built on hatred of others is totally against Jesus and His Gospel. It is clearly demonic. Be it a family unit or otherwise. Jesus uses the family unit to make his teaching far more hard-hitting, especially because He will have been aware of family units built on common hatred. Ironically, this common hatred does hold people together quite well, at least for a while. But then, inevitably, the likes of Sam or Jesus enter, dividing up the hatred, burning the hatred with fire, as if dividing with a sword. It's bound to happen.

Sam was not going to go with the majority feeling, he knew the majority was wrong and did something about it. In the Gospel, Jesus never goes with the majority; again, because the majority is wrong. Jesus wants fire to burn up these foundational hatreds, so unity and community can happen.

How prepared are we to stand up against the majority, when we know deep down the majority is wrong or built on evil. Maybe, like Jesus, we have the support one of two others, and like Jesus, cause splits in feelings and attitudes, always to bring about peace, justice and truth?
