Psalter Week 1



When the wise person points to the moon, the fool sees only the finger. So, the ancient Eastern proverb goes. So true. Do we see the moon, or just the finger?

It would appear for Jesus, going to heaven is about having a different kind of wisdom than any popular idea of wisdom. He talks of the broad and narrow door, and we should try to enter through the narrow one. But I think the broad one needs some clarification.

The broad door (or gate) is NOT the way of wickedness, murder, stealing, abuse, corruption etc. Jesus certainly does not approve of these, but this is not the broad door. Nor is it sinful stuff, like disobedience, adultery, greed and so on. In other words, the broad path does not constitute the 'hot sins.

The broad door is the way most people appear to live their very conventional lives. Business as usual, everything taken for granted, all forever routine. We are so driven by our usual conventions, no questions are asked. It is called 'conventional wisdom'.

Jesus wants us to be delivered from this common, agreed-upon way of life. The majority can easily be wrong. This is all just seeing the finger. Rather, to stand out against this conventional wisdom, and be part of His own 'subversive wisdom' that turns conventional wisdom upside down. Not the usual conventions of achieving, attaining, succeeding, but of 'letting go' of these needs. That becomes the narrow door, it's the way to truly follow Our Lord. Not conventional ways that others dictate, but Our Lord's way. Others dictate upward mobility; Jesus dictates a downward journey – which becomes the way of the cross. That's far harder and demanding. Who really wants to go there? But it is finally the way of life, its real humility, love, forgiveness, peace, the stuff of the soul, not the stuff of conventional norms. Do we just see the finger or what the finger is pointing to?

So, it's not about how often I have been to Mass, how many prayers I've prayed, or even doing nice things, such people are often not known to Our Lord, ("I do not know you"), but being prepared to enter through this narrow door. Letting go of socially (at least some) agreed upon ways, the downward journey, making space for Our Lord. That is so much more challenging. Now our goodness and niceness is pure, without selfish agendas contaminating our energies. Then let go of these selfish agendas and make space for Our Lord...now.

When our faith allows us to let go of these conventional, social norms, incorruption and uncontaminated goodness follows. Otherwise, our so-called goodness or niceness is largely corrupted and contaminated with social pay-off agendas, questions about "what's in it for me", self-importance, looking to be noticed all the time. So often the shallow stuff of agreed upon conventional wisdom. Those who think their "niceness" is earning heaven for them. And Our Lord says, "I do not know you, depart from me all you workers of evil". Oops! Do we want the Lord to know and welcome us?

Letting go of this stuff is a challenge; letting go through real faith allows us to enter the narrow door.

Are we prepared to?
