

# OUR LADY OF RANSOM

21<sup>st</sup> September 2025    25<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Year    Psalter Week 1



Shabbily dressed, hair a-mess, a man walked up to the bank clerk in a Centre-of- London bank and requests a loan of £5000. Eying him over, the clerk informed him patronizingly that he would need some collateral to borrow against. Pointing to a Rolls Royce parked outside the bank, with the chauffeur sitting at the wheel, the man said it was his, and that the Rolls was his collateral. With some surprise, the clerk checked credentials, and yes, it was in fact his Rolls Royce. The man explained that he was going abroad for two weeks and on his return, he would pay back the £5000 plus about £75 interest. He also requested that they keep the Rolls safe. “Of course,” reassured the clerk, “we’ll keep it in our underground car park on CCTV until you return and pay us back”.

All happened exactly as agreed. On giving back the £5000 plus interest, the clerk questioned him. “Sir, while you were away, we checked, and we found out that you are company director of several global corporations, chairman of various boards – in fact you are a seriously wealthy man! Why did you need to borrow £5000? He answered, “where else in the Centre of London can I park my Rolls Royce for two whole weeks, know it’s being looked after, and all for only £75!”

A wonderful, updated parable on Jesus’ one today. Deceptive? Possibly. Yet not really if we’re honest. Was he doing this just for himself, or the benefits of others? Who knows? Nevertheless, pure genius? Yes, be canny, be wise to the ways of the world, but do not become overly attached – as one day, the ways of the world will fail us. Then what? So much is illusion. If we are too attached, we sink into major depressions when all goes pear-shaped. And it will, since nothing lasts forever. Is it worth it? So, do not become over-attached to these illusions.

Yes, and also, be worldly-wise, but also be equally focused on the eternal. Get a balance. Truly enlightened people experience the eternal *in* the world. (That is the deeper message of the *Incarnation*). These people can be totally and profoundly trusted. To be canny and worldly wise for the benefits and values of eternal life, the Gospel values.

Yet, if we overdo the eternal, we can be left foolish, delusional, isolated, and of little practical help to others in the here-and-now. What resources do we have that can bless others and honour God. Generosity today echoes into eternity.

But if we overdo the “this world”, we can be left shallow, addicted, selfish and without hope. Getting this balance right can take time and patience. But we must try. Money and possessions are not evil of themselves, they are temporary, but can be used for eternal purposes, such as helping others, building people up, even making friends. Gospel values. Our Lord wants us to be shrewd, like the man above, be wise, alert and resourceful, but do it for God’s Kingdom. Do we see aspects of the eternal in the here-and-now? Is the here-and-now showing us something of the eternal? That is where we witness true holistic wisdom.
