Jane was busy and successful, flying all over the world. On one of her routine flights, Jane was tired, waning a little peace and quiet. Waiting for the flight, she decided to find a secluded spot in the airport lounge to read her book. Moments later, an elderly lady came over, sat next to her, and said, "I bet it's cold in Oslo". Uninterested in her chat, Jane replied patronizingly and curtly "I suppose so" and moved her eyes immediately back to her book. Yet all the while the lady kept chatting and asking questions. Jane's answers continued to be curt, blunt and cold. The lady had said that she was going to Oslo to bring back her husband of 53 years who had just died there. Bringing his body home. But Jane was still curt and short. Relief came when they were called to board the plane. While boarding, she saw a young man sit down next to the elderly lady a few rows in front. Jane heard the lady say, "I bet it's cold in Oslo", and the two them chatted. His compassion for her was evident, strengthening for her impending ordeal.

Jane suddenly realised that she hadn't really noticed the woman's loneliness and sadness, her simple need to chat. Could Jane have engaged and given a lonely, sad, newly widowed lady some dignity and company, so needed, even if just a little? Why didn't Jane notice? Why was her book, and her need not to notice so important to her?

Today we hear about a wealthy man who doesn't notice the poor man's (Lazarus) desperation. We don't know if the wealthy man had actually done anything wrong, just that he didn't care to notice. His desire to not notice is what condemns him. Maybe if he had noticed, he might have cared and acted differently.

Where are the 'Lazaruses' in our lives? Our Lord calls us to see them in the contexts of our daily lives. Maybe someone is desperate and asking for help, the clue may be them saying "I bet it's cold in Oslo". Something on the face of it, completely innocuous. Yet it's a cry to engage, a cry for help, to maybe offer assistance in some small way. Do we engage or are we curt and cold for fear of getting involved? Or we simply can't be bothered. What are we really frightened about?

Can we engage? Are we prepared to? God's kingdom is in the everyday affairs of our lives. "Hidden in plain sight" as theologians say. God is right there. The issues are right there. Maybe, right in front of us. Do we notice? The problems are very often disguised as a 'Lazarus'. Again, Jesus gives us something to seriously ponder. Do we experience God's reality in our everyday lives? Do we truly notice the issues and problems going on, in and around us, and engage? Maybe we are a part of God's answer....

Is someone saying - 'I bet it's cold in Oslo...'


