OUR LADY OF RANSOM

30th Sunday of the Year 26th October 2025 **Psalter Week 2**



Being punched on the nose is not nice! So it was when Jack, a heavily built man lost the plot and I happened to be there. Nose bleeds and bruises. I suspect it was partly because he was unable to name and address the turmoil going on in his heart and head. His girl-friend had just left him. It really was nothing to do with me. Unable to deal with his anger, he projected it on to me. Should I have hit back? No! Should I have prosecuted Jack or complained? No! Why? Because Jack was a man with serious mental health challenges at several levels. He wasn't really to blame. If I was to be blamed in any way, maybe it was because I was in the wrong place at the wrong time!

It's difficult to say whether Jack could have articulated the angry and confused demons deep down that he felt threatened by, which led to his outburst. Demons such as judgement, accusation, criticism, bitterness, jealousy, envy and so on. When not addressed, we know that they can, at least eventually, lead to monstrous behaviours. The name of the game is to name and acknowledge them. Identify and articulate them. Once we do, we take control of them. We have authority over them. Otherwise, they control us. These emotions direct our lives. Who wants it? We see only too often the results of years of denial, pretending they are not real. All been repressed. Monsters festering within, waiting to explode.

Hence our beautiful Sacrament of Reconciliation. A chance to articulate them in sacred space, so we take authority over these demons within, and they in turn lose their power and control over us.

Jesus is re-defining holiness as not the absence of these demons but admitting them. It's what made our Saints so great. Being radically honest about ourselves – the good and the not-so-good living within. So simple yet can be so hard. To look honestly at the good, and not-so-good, living within us becomes real humility. We become humble. In other words, humility is ultimately honesty. We neither exaggerate nor minimize what's going on within, but honestly accept what is. Not what "ought" to be, not what we "want" things to be, but what is. To see things as they "really" are, that in turn, may (or may not) call us to change.


The 'good' Pharisee, self-righteous and arrogant, does not see anything negative within. Like a 'good' catholic, keeps rules, gives to the poor, fasts. Does all the "right" things. The 'good' Pharisee looks down on the wicked tax collector. Do we look down on anyone? Actions scorned by Jesus! Yet the despised tax collector is radically self-honest, naming and acknowledging the truth living within. He becomes justified. That's all God wants from us. Self-honesty. Humility. Then, we too are justified, and experience being set free. Isn't that worth it?




