OUR LADY OF RANSOM

2nd November 2025 All Saints Psalter Week 2



He can drive the patience of a Saint!! Words we sometimes use. What do we really mean by "Saints".

Our Catholic Church canonizes Saints, declaring them to be in heaven. As our models, we are called to imitate them, to follow their example. That's why they are given to us. Not to leave them on pedestals, thinking they are something totally different from me, but simply to do as they did. We ask them to intercede through our efforts in following their examples; to follow the paths they have traced for us.

We are talking about women and men just like ourselves. Just like you and me, they were not perfect, but through profound faith and trust in Our Lord, they are totally honest and open about their dark sides as well as their bright sides — ie. sins, weaknesses, stupidities, as well as their patience, love, justice and so on. This allows for healing to happen. A tough call but liberating. Free from the numerous emotional burdens we carry around, so crushing. And often, for so long. Stuff we are often too embarrassed to be open and honest about. So, it all gets pushed down, and we feel so un-free. What a burden to carry! And for so long! Honesty and openness lead to huge grace, to true wholeness, true holiness — freedom. Relief! Put another way - Lord, by your Cross and Resurrection....

...You have set us free. We know that prayer, we say it, yet we can remain so un-free. Why are we not letting Our Lord's Cross and Resurrection do what it's meant to do for us? Free us. How wrong and self-defeating can we get – not allowing what Our Lord's Cross and Resurrection has done for us, to set us free. Why can't we, like saints, be free? If you read some of the writings of the Saints, you will see how honest and open they are about themselves, the good and the not-so-good. They understood. They were free. They knew who Our Lord was for them. That's why we are called to follow them. So, we can be helped to become free too. "Happy are you, when you are free enough to follow God's will and not give in to the numerous temptations of the world", might be a reasonable paraphrasing of today's Beatitudes, today's Gospel. The temptations of the world can leave us so un-free. The Saints were free enough to do exactly this, follow God's will, even at a cost, a big cost. What is more important for us, the cost, or true freedom.

Ghandi called these Beatitudes Jesus' 'piece de resistance'. He seemed to get it. It is Jesus' manifesto for exactly what he was going to do, and he did it, in his own body. It really is the key to true happiness, to true freedom. Ghandi, a Hindu, understood. Do we?

What about us? Do we care? Is all this just some piein-the-sky fluffy ancient poetry and we leave it there? Do we have faith that Jesus said this, and said it for a reason? Do we want to be free? Like all Saints, what are we prepared to do about it?


















Choir Needs You (Yes, You!)
