OUR LADY OF RANSOM

23rd November 2025 Christ the Universal King C Psalter Week 2

She slapped us around. Her slaps on the head gave us throbbing headaches.

She put the very fear of God into us. So, it was with one of my old teachers. Many schools operated that way in those days — and much worse as many will testify. The only teacher I felt I could never really forgive — for the way she so frightened us children. I thought I'd put it all past me as an adult. Then, by chance, I was called to the hospital to give her the Sacraments. Was it really her? Surely not! But it was. I saw her in the second-last bed on the right-hand side of the ward. Of all my old teachers — why her? I stood by the ward door, almost paralyzed, painful memories flooding back. A cold fear genuinely gripped me. The nasty headaches from her head slaps. Did she deserve forgiveness? She was seriously ill. I knew I must let go, I must try and forgive. After all, I am a priest. I think I managed — but it wasn't easy. I gave her the sacraments peacefully. All was well, literally — thank God. I like to think we both experienced some form of healing — even in her semi-conscious state.

Forgiveness is never easy nor instant. Only a fool thinks otherwise. An authentic appreciation of the cross demands that we at least try. To realize, that so often, our enemies or opponents are not so much evil in themselves, but symbols of a bigger evil, and that they are victims of this larger evil. Please think about that. It needs thinking and praying about Who is your that person you hate? That person may well be a victim of some larger evil. And, for us, they become the very symbol of that evil. To hold on to this truth allows great compassion and forgiveness to happen.

My old teacher may have been a victim of the general nastier methods in teaching of her day. That's the bigger evil. For me she was a symbol of that evil. As many teachers were in those days.

Jesus, at his lowest ebb of life in brutal agony, from the cross, forgives the repentant thief, and those around him as they 'knew not what they were doing'. Is this mercy just fantasy? Or a nice bit of moral behavior from the Lord? Nice poetry? Or, something real, a perennial truth we are all called to learn from and follow.

An authentic appreciation of the cross is saying that we must fight evil, prayerfully, peacefully, non-antagonistically, even lovingly. Again, this can allow for real forgiveness to happen. Knee-jerk reactions of revenge and hate only serve to complicate things; they produce negative energies which are in turn deepened; and we increase the endless cycle of violence. Hating our enemy makes us just like them. (Hitler said that). We assimilate their energies. Now they call the shots. Is it all worth it?

When Pope Pius gave us this feast of Christ the King 100 years ago, it was a reminder that Mussolini was not king, in other words, the tyranny of power, status, and money should never be the controlling factors in life. These are NOT king. Christ is. And only Christ. Only His compassion, love, forgiveness and humility really work and make our world a better place. Are we prepared to let these Gospel necessities happen through us?
















Choir Needs You (Yes, You!)
