"Time, ladies and gentlemen please" – a cry from the bar. A few minutes before, there might be a bell indicating last orders. Familiar? Last orders ring out, people scramble to the bar, argy-bargy, push and shove to get to the bar first, each holding up high their £!0 or £20 notes very visibly to catch the bar person's eye and get served quicker.

The rush to get as many in before the bar closes. Still goes on in places. Does that reflect in our lives too? We rush around, chasing our tails, because we feel we must get everything in. We end up doing things mindlessly, brain-dead, "un" conscious, sleep-walking – rushing around can leave us locked into these rigid, mindless, repetitive patterns of thinking and behaviour.

From his numerous psychiatric analyses of people, C.G. Jung says that 95% of people spend 95% of their time sleepwalking. Routines, set-in-their-ways, creatures of habit. People doing things so mechanically, with no life, vitality or aliveness. No Holy Spirit of aliveness and vitality guiding them into newness. Same old, same old. People, like robots, mindlessly repeating the same old thing day after day. We are so easily led into this horrifying world of continuous sleepwalking, — and so often, we don't even realise it. That is very scary!

Jesus also appreciated this. Hence his cry to "stay awake". Be *alert, alive. conscious, be aware* of everything around us. We miss so much because we are largely unconscious. Being unconscious, we miss the Christ. The cry of the Buddha was similar – Buddha means to be awake –awake to reality around us. Why miss so much good, beauty and truth?

All these rushing and mindless routines never feed the soul. Advent is a time to stop, reflect, think clearly, pray, touch base, prepare, and ask ourselves 'where my life is really going'? What is it all about'? Is my soul being fed? Is the deeper part of me being fed?

"Time, ladies and gentlemen please", is God's call, not to close the bar, but to open and awaken our hearts to Him and finally start to really "see" life, experience it, and enjoy it to the full. And of course, in that, we really encounter the Christ.

Like the hypnotist, who on the count of three, snaps his fingers and brings the person out of hypnosis back to the world of the real, the here and now, so, in many ways, Advent is that sharp finger snap to all of us to snap out of our sleepwalking, our unconscious state, and awaken to God's truth, beauty and goodness all around. God's reality in the here and now. Do we see and listen? Or do we mindlessly carry on?

Of course, there are many who won't listen as many of those think they know better! They will sleep-walk through Advent and Christmas, suffer hangovers and headaches wondering what it's all about. For them, it's just another superficial and hollow Christmas, devoid of any depth, substance and meaning – more mindless routine. They will sleep-walk through Advent, Christmas, and life generally – must **we**? Or are we prepared, as Jesus urges, to "stay awake".


