"So, girls and boys" said the teacher, "can any of you mention something of extreme importance that did not exist 50 years ago?" Little Tommy put up his hand and eagerly shouted, "Me!".

We all want to feel important at times. But any true following of Christ means that somewhere around the middle of life we must learn to start letting go of these needs for importance. Or life will do it for us, and that will hurt, and hurt badly. John the Baptist lets go of his popularity and power to make way for the Christ. This is his brilliance. He could have used it for his own ends. Maybe this is partly why Jesus refers to him as "no greater than John has ever been seen". He is clearly a man for God and a man for truth.

Yet with all that, as brilliant as John is, he is not sure Jesus is <u>the</u> one who is coming. He knows however that "one" is coming. This is quite possibly because he wanted to see a little more "retribution, exclusivity and punishment" talk. But Jesus talks equally of reconciliation, compassion. tenderness, forgiveness and healing – all possibly leaving John a little confused.

Maybe a slightly confused John. But then we look at John's ways. Arguably he is abrasive, impatient, tactless, maybe tunnel-visioned, maybe not possessing the greatest verbal and relational skills. Heavy on confrontation, retribution, justice and God's wrath. Possibly overly moralistic and harsh. Maybe this is why Jesus then says, "the least in heaven is greater than he".

John is not yet the reconciler, the healer, the man of compassion, tenderness, mercy, tolerance and patience. It often takes later life enlightenment to really take these qualities on, at least in a bigger way. This is where Jesus takes John's message forward. John is speaking from great experience and knowledge. John is right, but only as far as he goes. John clears the way for Jesus so there is freedom for the bigger message. John "literally" gets out of the way. He lets go of who he is, along with his mission, to make way for Jesus.

Much of religion, sad to say, has followed in much of John's ways and not the ways taken forward by Jesus. Exclusivity; impatience, retribution and intolerance. So much focus on retribution and following the "right"

rules with too little focus on life-giving relationships; too much lacking mercy; defining who's in and out, up and down, who can receive and who can't, and so on. How dare we! As if we really know! Maybe that is, at least, partly why much religion is frowned upon today.


Our religions are meant to heal, reconcile, demonstrate authentic compassion and God's endless mercy. That is why it is good news. Anything else is a fraud – bad news. Gospel means "good news". Are we "John the Baptists", following John alone? Or are we finally and hopefully, "Christians?"
