Peculiar diet. Weird dress sense. He calls a spade a spade. He is not a company man. He does not fit in. Probably, no self-respecting Christian denomination today would allow him in. He is not afraid. He doesn't care who he upsets – especially authority and establishment - welcome John the Baptist.

John comes from a wealthy class. His father was a chief priest. So, he must have been wealthy. John would have been steeped in the Jewish religion and tradition, especially with his father, Zecchariah, being a chief priest. There is virtually nothing John would have not known about his Jewish religion. So why is John like this? Possibly, from within his own religion, he sees so much oppression and nonsense. Also, because he has had a genuine experience of the divine. We only need one experience of the absolute, the divine, in our lives and everything becomes relativized around this central experience. We can then find it hard to deal with others whose lives seem centered on a kind of wishy-washy mediocre sense of reality. These prophets so much want everyone to have similar divine experience so as we understand ourselves.

Such prophets stand on the edges of tradition, system, society or religion, inside just enough to say, 'I am one of you', but not seduced by the ego desires of power, status, promotions, pay-offs and rewards — all coming from the centre, the seat of power. Both inside and outside at the same time. It's a narrow road. Jesus later refers to this narrow road saying that few have the spiritual maturity to walk it. To be totally loyal, yet utterly and positively critical at the same time. Real prophecy. We see John being a truly great prophet.

He lives in the desert presumably so as not to be seduced by the power games of the system coming from the seat of power at the centre. Maybe he felt if he returned to this centre, he might be tempted back to his old wealthy ways. No thank you! From the edges, his message is clear. If you call yourself a Christian and say you know God, then produce the results. Results happen because we let go of ego nonsense. Anyone can say 'I'm Catholic' or 'Christian'. John rages against this hypocrisy, people calling themselves Godly, Christian etc, and yet are so seduced by power, status and pay-offs. John urges us rather to show some fruit.

How is our life-style different to non-Christians? Has this shown itself to be true over recent years? If not, could that be why our Christianity is under threat? People are wise to these double-standards. Too much talking and not enough walking (lifestyle). Is John, right? And what about us? Are we so seduced by power,

privilege and status at work, or in our groups, in life generally? Can we let go of some of these ego desires? Can we be utterly loyal and yet critical without compromise? Today, our Christianity is under threat. What fruits is our Christianity producing as different to those who claim to have no faith? That is surely, in part, the litmus of how genuine our faith is.


