

OUR LADY OF RANSOM

18th January 2026 2nd Sunday of the Year Psalter Week 2



His packet of crisps; wanting to share some with me made me feel very special. Because teenager Robert was deaf, dumb, he had the mental age of two (according to the doctors) and subsequently went blind. (I have mentioned him before). His small, yet for me, wonderful acts of generosity made me feel special. He did other things which would leave a lump in the throat too. A spiritual maturity that seemed to defy his mental and physical limitations.

For me, Robert's generosity was extra lovely given his circumstances. Whether it's Robert, or a great Saint, these people make us feel special, chosen. They simply 'know' they themselves are special, (maybe a pre-conscious knowing, as in Robert's case), now they communicate that specialness to us; to let us know we too are God's special and chosen ones.

When God "chooses" people, it is not because he likes them more, or thinks they are better or more worthy than anyone else. Definitely not. He chooses them because they are more receptive to his love and they can then communicate that love to everyone else. Whether, and how much, we are receptive is up to us. As the "chosen race", the Jewish people had that very same responsibility. It's all about how receptive we are.

The basic rule is that you can only facilitate transformation in others to the degree you have been yourself transformed in God's love. You can only lead people as far as you yourself have gone. So, we need to know and experience strongly that we are special, deeply loved in order to communicate that love to others, to pass it on. Hence the need for Saints and/or chosen people. If we do not appreciate this truth, then our faith becomes exclusionary, we assume superior positions against those who are apparently not special, not chosen or worthy, all of which are contrary to Jesus and St. Paul's teachings on being totally inclusive.

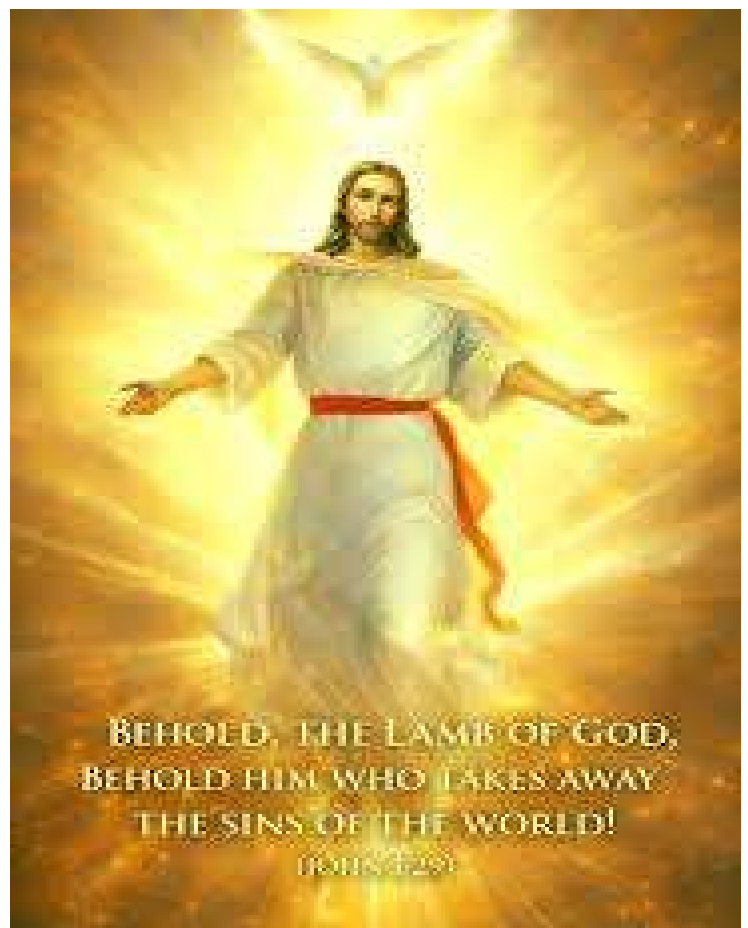
St. Paul knows he is an Apostle of God, called to facilitate everyone becoming Saints (our second reading). He wants to let everyone know their specialness in God's eyes. We are all chosen, special, worthy, but how much do we experience that for ourselves? How receptive are we? That is the key. Often, we need the 'Roberts' of the world, those who 'simply know' - they then communicate that wonderful truth to us. And we in turn pass it on to others... we simply want to, and can't resist passing that specialness on to others.

WHO IS ST GERARD MAJELLA?

Gerard Majella was born in April 1726 in the town of Muro Lucano in Southern Italy. He came from a poor family, and had to work from an early age after the death of his father.

Inspired by a Redemptorist parish mission, he ran away from home at 23 to join the order as a Lay Brother.

Brother Gerard worked variously as a tailor, cook, sacristan, gardener, and carpenter in Redemptorist monasteries, and always maintained a disciplined prayer life.

Perhaps remembering his own poor background, Gerard always had a heart for those in need. He was generous to those who came begging at the monastery door, and often visited the needy to provide material and spiritual care.

He became particularly associated with couples looking to have children, and expectant mothers, thanks to several miraculous occurrences. This has continued after his death, and he is popularly invoked as "The Mother's Saint".

He died at only 29 from tuberculosis, and was immediately hailed as a saint by the ordinary people. He was Beatified in 1893 and Canonised in 1904. To celebrate his 300th anniversary, the Redemptorists of the London Province are bringing his relics to every diocese in England and Wales.
