1st February 2026 4th Sunday of the Year Psalter Week 4



“Don’t trust those politicians because they break their promises”, many may say. The expression ‘U-turn’ seems to be widely used today. The argument is that they produce manifestos, promises, and do not stick to them. But then, maybe, some policies or manifestos need changing given the changing climate we live in. Nevertheless, the feeling is that it is often a game just for politicians to get into power. Manifestos broken. Too much self-interest. Maybe. But then, maybe not.

Today Jesus produces His manifesto. He has called his disciples, and now summarises what he will preach, setting out his vision. Often called the “Sermon on the Mount” they are the ‘Beatitudes’, the ‘be-aufiful attitudes’, that if followed are the key to authentic happiness. St Luke’s truer translation is much tougher.

The difference between Jesus and any politician is that Jesus lives out his manifesto, lives out his vision in every sense, in his very body. Ghandi thought that these Beatitudes were Jesus’ “pièce de resistance”. He got it. Many Christians do not, they yawn and skip over it. Pious platitudes? No! Pleasant considerations? No. Be sad now, so you will be happy in the next world? No - absolutely not! Jesus’ equivalent to the ten commandments - definitely not! No! no! no! no! no!

Something hugely deeper. Maybe it is too threatening for many, so it is avoided. In this vision, Jesus is subverting the whole social world order, turning everything as previously understood upside down. Too threatening to anyone who wants to climb the ladder of success, wealth, and power – or if they are already at the top. Often better to pretend these Beatitudes are just a piece of nice rhetoric, or nice poetry – or that “Jesus didn’t really say that”, or “we have misunderstood”. I’m afraid He did say it and intended it to be threatening – this is consistent with His teaching generally.

In short, Jesus is saying that those who are **not** unhealthily attached to worldly things, such as prestige, power, possessions, status, craving self-satisfaction and approval – these people are the fortunate ones, for they are free enough to experience God in their lives. It’s incredibly difficult (not impossible) to detach yourself from these things if you are climbing, near, or at the top of your game. For those who are detached, these worldly things are not coming between themselves and God, so true happiness is experienced – directly from God. Many do live this truth out in their lives and testify to their deep happiness. Jesus lives this truth out in his very life, to the very end. No compromise. How much can we live out this truth?

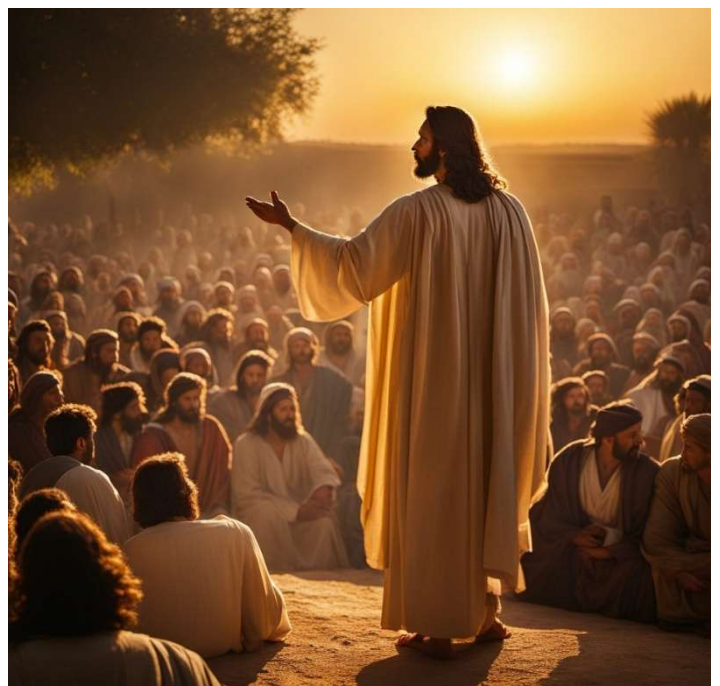
How blessed and fortunate (happy) are you, when you are not obsessed by the things of the world, and so are free enough to fully let God into your life and follow His will for you.
