Poking fun at us Catholics was not easy to listen to, especially at an Evangelical church service from their pulpit. To this day I don't know if the pastor knew I was a Catholic guest at his church. Poking fun about Holy Communion, Confessions, Bishops, the pastor was relentless. And people laughed. How immature and utterly pathetic! I only wish I'd had the courage at the time to tell him what I thought. My friend apologized profusely. I think words were had at a later stage.

Such 'fundamentalist' churches crave certainty. But in doing so, they make everything black and white and condemn most of the population who do not think the way they do. That is clearly not the way of Christ.

No-one and nothing in this world is totally good or totally evil, totally right or totally wrong – apart from God himself. We are forced to face these ambiguities. But we can so want everything to be easily labelled into good, evil, right, wrong – which of course makes life so much easier! But it is simply not true, and life is never that easy.

This is why Jesus gives us the parable of the weeds and the wheat. Pulling out the weeds (the bad) compromises the good (wheat). Wherever there is good, there will be some evil. And where there is evil, some good can be seen, especially by an enlightened person. Nothing but nothing is perfect. Everything is imperfect. Where there is light, there will be shadows. Once we learn to cope with imperfection – from our banks, to post office deliveries, our institutions, to our churches, our schools, children, parents, partners and families, we will become a happy people.

Like the weeds, evil is a parasite, a leech, wrapped around and intertwined with the good (the wheat) sucking its life force from it, or a malignant tumour wrapped around a vital organ, removing its goodness. Only by recognizing and admitting it, can we do something about it. We'll never totally be rid of it. Wise, careful recognition is half the battle.

This is why Jesus says sledgehammer approaches will not work. Or we so easily compromise the good. So, delicacy, trust wisdom, discernment, patience, subtlety, care and prayer are so often some of the tools needed. Then we can do something.
