

# OUR LADY OF RANSOM

9<sup>th</sup> August 2026 Nineteenth Week of the Year (A) Psalter Week 3



Driving his flashy Ferrari through a poorer part of town, the executive felt a sudden crack against the car door. A child had thrown a brick at the car. Screeching to a halt, he saw the guilty child, incandescent with rage, he pinned the child to a wall and gave him a torrent of verbal abuse. *Sorry*, pleaded the child, *I didn't know what else to do – no-one would stop*. Sobbing and spluttering, he pointed at a child lying on the road just around a parked car. *That's my little brother*, he said, *his wheelchair rolled off the curb and he fell out. He's hurt and is much too heavy for me to lift; you see, I've got calipers on myself so I can't even bend down*. Without words, the executive's whole demeanor softened, he picked up the little boy and placed him gently back in his wheelchair. *Thank you, God bless you*, said the little shaken lad, and the executive watched the boy limp off as he pushed his little brother into the distance. Wiping his own tears back and fingering the contours of the damage on his car, he vowed to himself never to have the door repaired. He needed that experience, as a profound and continual reminder.

Why do we go through life so fast we need a brick thrown at us to get our attention back on the things that really matter? What are we really focused on?

Sometimes the brick that is thrown at us is the one of suffering. Sadly, it is pretty well the only thing that will get our attention back on the things that really matter.

It may not be physically rushing around, but our minds racing. Think of the infernal and eternal queues at the supermarket, the airport, the spinning wheel on our slow-loading computer screens. The impatience in waiting because our minds are racing. Is such waiting an insult to us? Is our time being robbed? We instantly look for distractions to supposedly calm ourselves. The mobile, the sweets. Waiting can expose the so-called 'urgency' of our minds. In all of this, we miss the quiet of the Lord whispering to us. Some say that at that point, we need to stop, take a few deep breaths through the nose, to reconnect with our real selves. Then these "waitings" no longer really matter, because there is a calm in us. Rather than have impatient, annoyed and racing minds, we can even, quietly enjoy the moment.

God is forever gently whispering in our hearts, but our lives and minds can be so fast and furious that we never hear. Or we think that God will be in some thunderous apparition. This is Elijah's great revelation. And Peter's. As soon as Peter takes his mind off what matters, that is Our Lord, and focusses on the wind, he begins to sink. Or as Elijah discovers, God is not in the fast and furious of winds, fires, thunder or earthquakes, but in the gentle breeze. If only our hearts and minds slowed down and were open to this truth so we could hear. God is always gently whispering in our hearts. Such a profound and gentle beauty - so often missed.
